- *Kevin Gale of Rotary Club Canberra East spoke about prostate cancer. In 1992 the Rotary Club of Lane Cove in Sydney founded the Prostate Cancer Research Foundation to raise funds to finance research into this disease.

In Australia in 1995, 6000 men were diagnosed with prostate cancer, 2200 of these men died from the disease. If you have a brother or father with prostate cancer, your risk of contracting the disease is doubled. There are 2 forms of the disease, the first is quite common and poses no clinical problems for the sufferer. The second form is characterised by dribbling and frequency. Testing methods are by either digital examination, PSA test or biopsy and none of these are foolproof.

What if you are diagnosed? You have 3 options. 1) Do nothing and the disease could spread, 2) Radio Therapy Treatment can help but it also can just "stun" the disease and not kill it outright leaving it to become active again, 3) Surgery is also an option but until you undergo the procedure it is not known how far the disease has spread.

After being informed of the above your Doctor is likely to ask you to decide which of the 3 available options you wish to take.

What is needed is further research into prostate cancer, for every dollar spent on prostate cancer research \$20 is spent on breast cancer research.

The aim of the Prostate Cancer Research Foundation is to raise \$5 million over the next 3 years and use the interest from this to fund research. Alyson H-J of our Club has volunteered to act as coordinator for this project and no doubt over the next year or two Alyson will be asking us to help the Foundation raise this fund. Ashtons Circus have agreed to donate their first nights takings plus 20% of the net takings when they come to town and the local Club helps promote the event.
