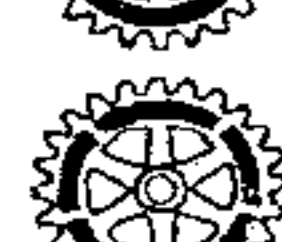

Vintage Car Classic: November 500 to 1,000 people expected. Les Sutcliffe to represent Rotary at meeting next week.



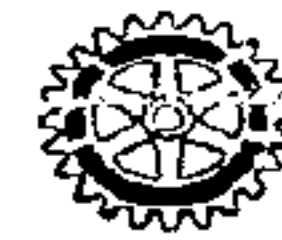
Duntroon Military Band: Arts Council event 23/5/99. Multifunction Centre.

Land Mine Search: A "Magic Bullet" developed in USA, can be fired into suspected ground from a helicopter, and emits powerful radio, which reacts with land mines, and sends location signals to the 'copter. There are an estimated 100 million mines still buried. (The Rotarian, March, p.10)
