ROTARY INFORMATION: From the Moment Rotary Became International

With the formation of a club in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, in 1910 it began its search for the path to world peace and understanding. When the Rotary Foundation was created in 1917, Rotary had a specialised vehicle to travel that road. After 30 years of world wars and depression, founder Paul Harris's death in January 1947 became the catalyst that caused Rotarians to seriously begin to develop programs and initiatives in pursuit of world free of serious conflict.
