Our recently returned Global Youth Exchange student, Louisa Pauletto spoke on her exchange in Germany. Her views on this country and its people had been based on SBS television programs. However, this trip broadened her horizon and gave her a first hand view of a foreign environment. She was in North West Germany, north of Hamburg - quite a change from summer in Cooma to winter in Germany. Her host families were excellent and she was quickly adopted into them. (Of particular note, an 83-year-old grandmother who assisted her to learn the local language, rode a horse everyday and out-walked her.) She made a couple of faux pas in early language translations, but on the whole found the German people very hard working, community and family orientated with a culture for good food, strong family association, and a liking for beer fests. A changed perspective to that seen on SBS, and everything very open, even the Prison camps, of which they are not very proud. School was very different, especially getting up at 5.30 am to go to school in the dark from 6.15 am to 1 pm and then coming home again in the dark. Students are encouraged to be very positive, responsible for their own behavior. (Learn German, French, Latin and English also). Whilst there she attended 5 Rotary meetings, there are no women in Rotary there and meetings are much more staid than that of our club. The exchange has given Louisa a changed and positive outlook, and I am sure she was an excellent ambassador for Australia, Cooma and Rotary and wetted her appetite for further travel.
