LAST WEEKS MEETING:

Graham French, who is on the Board of the Raglan Gallery, gave us a view of the last 7 years of this local icon, and plans for its future. In 1994 the Council established the Raglan as a non-profit community gallery and cultural centre. In 94/95 there were 4 exhibitions/functions. 2000 had 7. Income peaked at \$47,000 in 99/00, local artist gallery sales peaked at \$36,000 in 98/99. The community supporting the gallery is 142 Friends (members), 80 sitters and reserves with 212 local exhibitors. Many people visit the gallery, but not all sign the attendance book, in April this year 85 people signed it, 395 from outside the Monaro region. 22% from NSW, 13% interstate, 4% overseas. The committee hope to have this recognised as a Regional Art Gallery that attracts not only arts but crafts, and the like that will encourage both visitors and locals to see displays. No doubt this will require a fair amount of funding work, volunteers and the like. So if you want to become involved or donate please see Graham.
