LAST WEEKS MEETING

Rotarian Richard Lawson spoke on THE ORDER OF AUSTRALIA which he is well versed in, being a former Assistant Director, Honors Department in Canberra.

From mid 1800 to 1975 Australia used the British system to recognize Australians contributions to society and he gave an outline of the British Honors and the example of Don May, a barber in a small SA town who was awarded an OBE for his going to the local hospital every Sunday for 30 years to give haircuts to patients there. The Australian System was introduced in 1975, has been modified since by several governments but is based on the British and Canadian system. The Australian Honors system has 5 categories Order of Australia, National Medal, Meritorious Service Award,

Australian Bravery Decoration and Defence Award. The Order of Australia has 4 levels, Companion (AC) Officer (AO) Member (AM) and Medal (OAM) Richard explain what each is given for and said "The order is about recognizing and celebrating outstanding achievements and contributions for extraordinary Australians in a diverse range of fields and achievements. He then outlined the procedures for nominations which are considered by the 19 members of the Council of the Order, are awarded twice a year. All applications are held in the office of the governor-general, and therefore not subject to

Freedom of Information. Most importantly a person doesn't get an award unless they are nominated.
