Challenge commence in the mid fifties, to provide services for children with disabilities as Governments didn't. This was done with suppo from Service Clubs, the Snowy, Community and cakes stalls to pay for a teacher. In the 70s the first workshop open in Cooma East. In the early 80s Governments started to provide education services for children with disabilities and 1986 Challenge COMMENCED 3 small business enterprises.1 Koombah Enterprise woodwork- who make and supply wood products including guideposts for R>T>A and Council. 2 Koombah Garden maintenance who contract gardening services in the area, including the courthouse, 3. ATC which carries out pamphlet folding and delivery als shredding and recycling. These activities not only provide employment for disabled clients but financial support. Challenge has a group house for 4 clients who require high support, however other clients live independently according to their supervision needs. There are 50/60 disabled clients of Challenge who require daily to weekly supervision Challenge has a staff of about 25, 3/4 full-time. They hope to start up a day service to assist intellectual disabled- who simply learn things more slowly but are individuals. Challenge was recently audited in accordance wi The disabilities Act and met the 11 standards required.
