In her present role Kathy provides assistance, help, guidance and planning to improve local events, to promote our unique location to outsiders to encourage them to visit, participate and support our local businesses and communities. Kathy did supply examples of spending by persons partaking in these events. Events included local, national and international events including Tour de Snowy, Cycling, Rowing, Skiing, sporting and other events held in the region. The Snowy Ride last year involved about 2,000 motor cycles and raised \$120,000 for the Children's Cancer appeal in 1 day. No doubt Kathy's experience and expertise in this field is of great assistance to our local organisers and volunteers in planning, promoting and running their events.
