#### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF ROTARY CLUB OF COOMA INC.

#### Scope

We have audited the financial statements of Rotary Club of Cooma Inc. for the year ended 30 June 2005. The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members.

CONSULTANT

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian auditing standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Australian accounting concepts and standards and statutory requirements so as to present a view of the Rotary Club of Cooma Inc. which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position and the results of its operations.

#### Limitation of Scope

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for Rotary Club of Cooma Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over receipts until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to receipts was limited to amounts recorded.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

#### **Audit Opinion**

Subject to the above limitation in our opinion, the financial statements present fairly the financial position of Rotary Club of Cooma Inc. as at 30 June 2005 and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended.
