GUEST SPEAKER

Ken Nicholls, a PDG in 87/88 in district 9690, was our guest speaker for the evening.

He worked on the Snowy Scheme many years ago and has been involved in Community Service for over 66 years, firstly as a scout in Cooma, scout leader, Apex, Disabled Association, Probus, Lions, P&Cs, Rotary Club of Granville and for the last 9 years has been heavily involved in RAWCS and coordinator of the RAWCs

warehouse at Prospect, with support and assistance from his wife Bobbie. His address was on RAWCS (Rotary Australia World Community Service) Whose object's are 1. Donations in Kind (DIK) 2. Fourth Avenue in Motion. 3. Rotarians against Malaria 4. Safe water saves lives. 5 Ranfurly Library Service. The RAWCS Ken is involved in covers 7 districts in eastern Australia, including ours. He explained DIK which was started by FAIM teams in 1988 for a school rebuilding program in the Solomon Islands after cyclone damage. He was virtual overseer of the project, also a CAT LAB project in Mongolia, Port Villa Hospital in Vanuatu, and on the well known Kokoda Track rebuilding of a school in Menari in 2002 (looked much better with the flooring inside and not on the roof) also the Kokoda Hospital. In respect of Malaria Eradication he suggested the Rotary Adopt a Village Project, to provide bed nets for villages and their education for their proper use.

He also outlined 6 areas that Rotarians can assist at the Prospect Depot.

We had 2 truck loads of equipment from Cooma Hospital dropped off there. He also left a flyer on the Pacific Islands Literacy Project, see President Kevin for a copy if you would care for one.
