GUEST SPEAKER ON JINDABYNE DAM WALL

LAST WEEKS MEETING the guest speaker was Ken Casley, who spoke on the upgrade of Jindabyne Dam Wall, which was carried out by the company he works for. Ken was born and reared in Victoria, is a civil engineer, married with 3 boys and when working in Fiji adopted a girl who lives with the family in Brisbane. Ken advised that the upgrade of the dam wall was necessary to meet new require-



ments and should be completed by end of July. He had overviews of the wall, before, during and the present time. These overviews showed the various stages of construction and Ken explained these, including the coffer dam the company built and the mini hydro plant that are included in this project. The project has used about 36,000 cubic metres of concrete, is about \$80,000 and employs on site 4



admin officers, 2 technical assistants, 4 foremen and about 180 workmen. He also gave us the company involved and its formation.
