Guest Speaker – Hayley Redhead



Guest speaker was Haley Redhead, the Youth Health worker for the Cooma Monaro Region. who grew up in Berridale and as part of her final year at Uni undertook the Berridale Youth Project and gave us an insight into this project. The aim was to work along side young people in Berridale to assist them in identifying, prioritizing and addressing their social and leisure needs. She targeted young people from year 6 to 10 at school and the first workshop she ended up with

22 boys and 11 girls, although at first there were only 10 boys and no girls, but this changed when the workshops for boys and girls were held on different nights and these were used to work out social and leisure needs, explain their needs, organizing activities, prioritizing, making group decisions on various skills. The boys wanted boxing, 2nd was shooting, the girls wanted girls nights. The workshops finished with a hot dog dinner, trivia night, with many prizes, organised by the youths to show the community their experience and ability. About 30 community members attended, including the mayor, who presented certificates. This youth group now meets fortnightly. Haley has a contract for 3 years 3 days a week, it covers 9 small Monaro towns of Jindabyne, Berridale, Dalgetty, Adaminaby, Nimmitabel, Numeralla, Bredbo, Bombala and Delegate a lot of traveling in 21 hours a week. Her goals are to link young people to primary health care and community services, produce and distribute the youth health information card, workshops in schools, continue the Little Black Book for seasonal workers, develop Planning Document, take an active role in Monaro & Bombala Youth Interagency to write a youth page weekly for YMCA & NEWS DGP No.2 Develop self Esteem and Confidence in Young People with Youth Week Activities, including BMX clinics, Talent Quests, Artist & writers competitions and award nights, tube riding on lake Jindabyne. and the skateboard park, Road Safety Projects, Facilitate SRS Youth Council Meetings Involve young people in planning youth events, support these from the Community and organisations.
