DISTRICT CONFERENCE at the Bay

Friday 27th October through to Sunday 29th October, saw the Batemans Bay area as the venue for the Rotary District Conference.

The Conference was well attended and was possibly the best yet for District 9710. Over 400 delegates from all clubs in the District attended. All sessions were well patronised which gave much encouragement to the speakers.

Rotary joined other service clubs for the Annual Combined Services Dinner, this year organised by the ViewClub and the guest speaker was Suzie Balough OAM, an Australian Gold Medal shooter.

Suzie had only recently returned from a holiday in Hong Kong, and found it unusual travelling without her shotgun. She said she was and still is a daddies girl, started shooting ducks with him at a young age and at 15 was the youngest shooter in the Australian Championships. Why does she do it, what does she strive for, SATISFACTION, At her first shoot she only got 5 out of 50, and the personal challenge was to do better.

Trap shooting she said is 5% technical and 95% mental. She demonstrated the different postures of pistol, rifle and shot gun shooters. The later shot at moving clay targets, that travel at 140 km an hour, and you have to aim in front of the target having only 0.6 seconds to hit it. When she tried for Sydney Olympics even though she had beaten some who were selected, as she didn't have quota results from overseas events, she was only selected as a filler, not an Australian Rep. But this did inspire her to set the goal to represent Australia in Athens and get quota post. Her goal was to win, the fear of failure by the little man on her shoulder, gave her the motivation she needed. She also gave us some of the results of her shoots that had her selected for Athens, although there was a personal matter with her mum being diagnosed with breast cancer. The weather at Athens was going to be very blustery and windy, so she trained on a shooting range at Darwin, adjacent to the Airport, and the planes landing and taking off were ideal to prepare for the Olympics. She also paid tribute to her coach Gary and his mental training.

Her first shoot was 23-25, 23-25 & 20-25 and she was told she had about 1&1/2 hours till the final, but 1 /2 an hour later she was called up and shot 66-75, 66-75 and even though was crying 71-75 and won the gold. her proudest moment was the flag raising. Of course she now wants to repeat this at Beijing. She answered several questions, of course the first from Rotarian Geof. In respect of sponsorship she has two Italian companies, one a gun manufacturer and one cartridges, and the lack of sponsorship compared to other sports. The extra costs of getting team reps to Games, such as soccer, basketball etc, that have several members compared to single reps like trap shooting. An excellent speaker and no doubt will have a future as a motivational speaker when she stands down as a trap shooter.
