## GUEST SPEAKER - IAN DEEGAN



LAST WEEKS MEETING, the guest speaker was lan Deegan, who opened his address with a couple of words in Japanese to Hanna, our Japanese exchange student. Ian claims to be a local as his family settled here in 1848. After finishing school at the start of WW2 he joined the Army and was

trained in Artillery, was one of 19 specially selected and trained to man 6" & 9" guns that were installed protecting several port sites in coastal NSW, from Wollongong to Newcastle. These guns shells weighed up to 3801bs and could travel up to 72 miles. He then transferred to the 6th Division and went to Queensland to train in jungle areas. Was stationed in Neewak, New Guinea to stop the Japanese southern advance towards Australia which was at Sepic River which is fast flowing and about 1 mile wide. On 6/8 the first Atomic Bomb was dropped at Hiroshima in Japan and caused a lull in the activities in New Guinea and on 15/8 was present at the airp[ort when General Robinson received the Japanese surrender. part of the 6, 7 and 9th Divisions who went to Japan after this bombing to locate stored Japanese weapons hidden in tunnels in the hills, and even in railway tunnels. He said the devastation at Hiroshima was massive and covered an area equal to Redfern, Kingscross, Pyrmont, Circular Quay, Broadway and Surrey Hills. At that time Japan had a population of 92 million, 78,000

were killed, 37,000 injured. At present the Japanese population is 126 million. Ian was very proud of the interaction with the children, to whom they gave chocolates and lollies.,The children didn't eat them there but took them home and shared with the family. They also had interaction with schools, but they were not so well received by the older residents. There was a shortage of rations for the Japanese, and the garbage bins were raided at night and all that was left was cardboard and paper, Wonder where the scraps went? There was also an atomic bomb dropped on Nagasaki, an industrial and coal mining area in Japan After this UK,



Aussie & NZ POW's were repatriated, this included a local in Kevin Jamieson. However several of the troops who worked in these atomic bomb sites suffered injures from the ash, including his wife Norma.

A very interesting and informative address. Ian and Norma were also on a Jumbo Jet that was recently photographed over an erupting Volcano which was shown on TV.
