LAST WEEKS MEETING, the guest speaker was Steve Anderson who spoke on acupuncture and his entry into this profession. His hobbies are fly fishing and tia Chi. He was born and reared in Wagga Wagga, left school at 15 became a carpet layer, then moved to the Gold Coast, had acupuncture due to Job related injuries, took up tia chi with a Chinese median, commenced studying at a college there in acupuncture, a small component of Chinese medicine. He said acupuncture is manipulation of the bodies vitality using a needle. He then went to Tokyo to extend his

studies, but his taxi fare on arrival at the airport nearly used up all his savings. He studied with Edward Obaidey, probably the most prolific acupuncture teacher in the world. He gave us Edward's daily routine, rise at 5am write charters, Gam Tia Chi, English breakfast, cycle to work, treat patients to 7pm then cycle home. Steve gave us an overview of the life style in Japan, Edward regularly smoked whilst treating patients, (but lived to 82 years of age) some of his frolics on the orange pushbike he cycled around on, treatment of a patient sent in by her husband using burn type acupuncture, he stayed there for 5 years and met his future wife Natalia who also accompanied him last night.

He said acupuncture has been used to treat a wide range of problems for over 4,500 years and the 5 elements of Chinese Medicine were FIRE HEART, EARTH STOMACH & SPLEEN WATER = KIDNEYS, WOOD LIVER.. METAL=LUNGS

He said there is no register of acupuncturists practicing in NSW yet. He has been in Cooma for 3 years.
