Guest Speaker was David Innes, a teacher from Monaro High School, who was one of the team leaders that escorted 16 school children from Cooma for a visit to their sister City Yamaga, Japan. David was introduced by Rotarian Katrin Hackney a fellow team leader on this trip who assisted in the presentation. Yamaga is about 2 hours north of Nagasaki but the temperature was about 36 degrees and very humid, a bit different from Cooma in winter and even summer. None of the team spoke Japanese but they had a translator

with them. They showed overviews of the sister city, places and events visited, including the Lantern Festival which has about 1000 girls dancing on the stage, these people are very proud of their heritage. However they had a change in food style, and ate raw horse flesh and then tried raw horse liver, which was not to their liking. It was a different culture to what Aussies are used to. School is from 8am to 7pm, although 4pm to 7pm is usually sports orientated. It is a cash society
