gave us an update on the Polio eradication program, which is still progressing, Statistics from worst effected countries are;

Bernie also promoted Rotary's clean water, literacy and education projects. He told us of an Indian housing project and shared with us the story of a 12 year old girl in an African country having to sell her body on the streets. A visiting Rotarian said "don't you know you can get Aids" to which the

girl replied "Yes but with Aids I will live for 4 or 5 years, if I don't get money today my family may all be dead next week". That Rotary club arranged a shipload of supplies as soon as they returned home. It makes you realise how important literacy and education is. The newest Rotary club was recently chartered in Antarctica, (maybe Peter Davis might go there for a makeup after he finishes the PNG project). Bernie also advised that Rotary Clubs are banned in China, but there are 2 clubs there for the westerners who live there, the police regularly raid the meetings and arrest the attendees to show who's in charge. Bernie Also encouraged president Cheryl to try for a Presidential Citation, she has already achieved some of the requirements. A 1% increase in membership is reasonable but Districts desire for 15% of members under 40 will be challenging.

Bernie has been a visitor to our club on several occasions and complemented the club on its ambiance, fellowship and community involvement. which was also mentioned at the Mayoral Reception for the DG by Mayor Tony Kaltoum.

There were even half full medicine bottles amongst the hospital ruins. Over 400 Australians had to wait up to 11 weeks to be evacuated from here by foot, yet planes were landing regularly to deliver bosses like General Vasey. It was decreed by the military not to airlift the sick and wounded personnel to safety.
