Then to LODZ, where they had a few days in a hotel. They visited the 'manufaktura' a series of old textile factories belonging to Jewish merchants who were leaders in the trade in 1895. The factory established a hospital for their workers This trip is 23,000Km through every state of Aussie including Tassie and he hopes to complete in 69 Days visiting 50 Rotary Clubs and raising \$40,000 for ShelterBoxes to ease human suffering, suffering from earthquakes, floods, war and civil unrest. This humanitarian aid is on a global basis and is delivered in easily transported green boxes, 3 feet x 2.6 feet x 2 feet weighing 56 KGS, containing a tent to sleep 10 people, 10 sleeping bags, 10 thermal blankets, pillows, cutlery, plates, metal pegs,

pack and some food. In some tropical areas this is changed slightly with thermal blankets replaced by and extra tent etc. The cost of a ShelterBox is \$A1,200 and they have been supplied to Timor, Indonesia, PNG and the Solomon Islands, near Australia also to China and Burma.

Since the inception of ShelterBoxs in February 2002 more than 50,000 ShelterBoxes have been supplied to 33 countries.

At the present time 240 ShelterBoxes are in Australia and four Australians

are now fully trained as members of the ShelterBox Response team (SRT) but the target is 20 by the end of 2008.

They work closely with the United Nations Agencies. Des paid thanks to the founder Tom Henderson and his wife for her support (even though he is getting out of mowing the lawns for 10 weeks)
