

Breaking the Sound Barrier

This week Steve Shirvington talked about his time working in Sydney for Philips Defence Systems and the partnerships Philips and Hughes Aircraft Company forged over several years. Some of the interesting snippets Steve discussed were centred around the AIP (Australian Industry Participation) program introduced in the early eighties when the RAAF upgraded their fleet from the Mirage III to the F/A-18 Hornet. The Hornet was the first aircraft that could accelerate vertically (against the force of gravity), it doubled the reliability of any fighter bomber in any inventory at the time and took half the time to maintain. The teaming of Philips and Hughes blossomed into a full blown partnership with the two companies

working on many joint programs including the manufacture of satellite components with Australian built components flying in 70% of the worlds communication satellites, the Smog Dog remote sensing system and the first "Open Road" electronic tolling system in Australia which was installed on the M5 tollway south west of Sydney.


