AST WEEKS MEETING was attended by six visiting first year medical students from ANU Canberra, three addressing the meeting. On introduction, Tony Slater read a letter from Dr. Wiles that set out the three aims of this program. The first speaker was Konrad Reardon who stated that each student has to have a post graduate degree before entering a Medical degree, but not always associated with medical study. LAMBIE PRE SCHOOL FETE The club's BBQ raised about \$300, which will be shared with the Pre school.


