uest speaker was Col Pilkington who grew up in Sydney became a teacher for 24 years, in the city and country, in primary and secondary schools. Col taught at Monaro High for 11 years before he retired. Col saw the need for mentoring students at risk, whether it be family difficulties, death, separation, divorce, ill health, financial difficulties or learning disabilities. He heard of a mentoring program at a south coast

school where they were repairing bikes for disadvantaged children. Col met up with Chris Adams who was collecting bikes for children at Kemabolo - this is how the bike program in Cooma got off the ground. The school had interviews and four boys were selected to take part in repairing these bikes. Thanks to David Byrne, council facilities at Polo Flat were made available, as well as tools, oils and benches supplied. With the help of a few Rotarians, Lions and a Legacy volunteer to supervise and assist these students, they repair all the bikes stored out there until they are repaired then they go to Marco's for storage.




