Briscoe at the Raglan

Robatian Graham French who spoke about "Briscoe at the Raglan" gave us the background of John Harley Briscoe, 1939 -1996. John Harley was born in Wellington NZ but educated in Launcestern Graham School, Tasma-

nia. He had an early

career in the RAAF, joined the SMA in the early 60's living at Khancoban and was an inspector on dams, tunnels and power stations as well as a hard rock miner. During this period he manifested interest in painting and drawing, as a form of respite after serving long periods underground. He began with drawing etchings in pen wash and water colour, acrylic and then oils. In the late 60s the family moved to Cooma, restoring the house that is now Dieter's Hair Salon. John invented a copper etching process known as Photogrometry. His natural talents were recognised by G Townsend, one of Australia's leading water colourists. On resigning from the Snowy he concentrated on his painting endeavours; his first major painting for a theatre production was commissioned by Vic Government for educational purposes. He was a prolific artist and worked at the Raglan prior to moving to Bermague and had a one man 20 painting exhibition. His paintings are included in presentations across Australia and overseas. Paintings left at the time of his death now belong to the John Briscoe Family Trust to encourage young artists. The Raglan Briscoe Exhibition 2009 is the 10th annual exhibition and one of the major exhibitions in south eastern NSW and ACT, with major prizes totaling \$2,000 with 20 finalists submitting 41


