# Katrin steps up with SEAR

S tepping into the breach this week was Katrin Hackney who spoke with great authority on SEAR, the South East Arts Region, formed in 2002, one of thirteen in NSW. SEAR represents the five shires -Eurobodalla, Bombala, Cooma Monaro, Bega Valley and Snowy River. The board has fourteen members with council community representatives from each shire and four co-opted positions.

Katrin then gave a report on the representatives. Like similar organisations their vision covers things like: \*Cultural development expertise and advice; \*Cultural plan development production and review; \*Assistance securing grants and administering them if needed; \*Promote arts and culture - shire, regional and state wide; \*Regional touring programs for performance and exhibitions; \*Networking on behalf of art and cultural activities shire, state and regional wide; \*Audience development increase participation in arts and culture; \*Assist with development of creative industries and cultural tourism. Some of the projects they have been involved with over the last twelve months included: \*Partnership with National Parks to produce a children's book on threatened species - Jan Carrol and Melinda Perrin "Missing": \*"Farmer will Swap Combine Harvester for Wife" with rural health suicide prevention organisations; \*"Beyond Roundabouts" film and photographic exhibition to give young parents a voice; \*Digitising and Art Business Workshop, including series of creative volunteering workshops; \*Production of SEAR Map; \*Production tours ego "Burnt" with Sydney Theatre Co; \*Securing funding for indigenous arts project; \*Assisting with funding for Four Winds Festival; \*ACT reg. arts fund management; \*Country area support program grants; \*NIDA work-
