Siemens Science Experience

First speaker was Lauren Sullivan, on behalf of herself and the other sponsored student Elyssa Heise to the Siemens Science program, now called ACT Science Experience which took place at The Australian National University over 3 days and gave them the opportunity to visit leading scientific laboratories and facilities. Lauren and Elyssa also met the research scientists and engineers who work there and fellow students with similar interests in these subjects. It was a hands-on encounter with real scientific equipment and they learnt about different career options. Lauren's favorite subjects are English, science, chemistry, biology and is fascinated by the human body, how it fights diseases, and the brain's communication with other parts of the body. One highlight of the experience for her was when Dr Greg Lane, with the help of some volunteers, did some demonstrations with liquid nitrogen, which she explained. They then split into smaller groups and were presented with a challenge. Her group won the egg drop. At the Canberra Institute of Technology they had a fake crime scene and were shown how to identify different items and package correctly, fingerprinting and other items. She said in Year 11 and 12 she would like to focus on biology and chemistry and is interested in a career in foren-
