

know that there are over 10 million people in the greater metro region, it is the third largest inter modal port in the world, it is the second largest financial services market in the US and 30 of the Fortune 500 companies are based there including Boeing. McDonalds and Kraft. Famous Chicagoans include Obama and Oprah. The first Rotary was established in Chicago in 1905.

- * USA Demographics A lot of the differences between Australia and the US are due to population. Australia has 22 million, the US has 304 million. The US remains the world's largest consumer market with \$9 trillion spent each year, three times that of Japan. Changes to demographics will shape the US in the future. By 2050 the number of Latinos will double from 15-30% of the population, minorities will be the majority of the population by 2042 and the number of baby boomers will be 88.5 million by 2050 (doubled since 2008).
- * **Obama** Positive about Obama's election although he was handed a very tough job. May have bitten off too much in his first 12 months but has improved the US's image overseas. Has extended an "open hand rather than a clenched fist". For the first time there is an African American President and it gives African American kids something to aspire to (rather than being a sportsman!).

ountry music legend and philanthropist Dolly Parton will be a keynote speaker during the 2010 RI Convention in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, 20-23 June. Parton will speak at the morning plenary session on 23 June to promote reading among preschool children. She and the Dollywood Foundation's Imagination Library teamed up with Rotary International in March to help provide age-appropriate books each month to children from birth until age five. Since its launch in 1996, the Imagination Library has provided more than 23 million books to preschoolers.

In addition, three influential nonprofit leaders are also slated to speak during convention plenary sessions: Greg Mortenson, co- founder of the Central Asia Institute and coauthor of the New York Times bestseller Three Cups of Tea; Jo Luck, president and CEO. of Heifer International;



and Robert Mazzuca, chief scout executive of the Boy Scouts of America.
