he guest speaker Jane Cay, one of the birds from Birdsnest, who is rather passionate about technology and dresses, spoke on ecommerce and focus on on-line shopping, which highlights how integral the internet has become to the life of every Australian. Pretty amazing when you consider it didn't exist 20 years ago, now it is a research tool for

shopping, communication and entertainment. In 1995 there were only 500 million digital consumers, and there are now three billion digital consumers. Jane was born in Cooma in 1978, and after finishing school went to University in Sydney where eBusiness was the buzz word. She was fascinated with this and wanted to be part of this revolution which would change the way we learnt and did business. Jane got a job in ebusiness consultation, tackling big questions from major companies which she said caused her brain to explode with the pace, creativity and the challenge. Around this time she fell in love with a farmer and knew her life destination was in rural Australia and knew she wasn't a city corporate girl. Jane married and came back home to Cooma and bought into High Country Outfitters and found that she liked working on the retail floor, but Australia was so far behind the rest of the world with

on-line shopping, and thought the opportunity was enormous considering 43% of money spent on on-line shopping in Australia was spent overseas. So they started their on-line shopping in the old gambling den under Mainstreet, then moved to the back of Birdsnest and now on the top floor of Centennial Plaza.

This was a leap of faith, this has been a rollercoaster ride since then, with over 2000 people visiting the site each day and the team send out over 40 parcels a day. There is a complete line of clothing on line, they are open 24 hours a day and Jane said it is amazing what time at night or early morning people shop online. She did show some of the items displayed on-line, and changes to suit. She said they have a fantastic group of women shopping with them (men weren't included) and they sent out 1,300 newsletters out and the customers are 39% NSW, 21% Vic, 16% SA and

11% WA. They employ 20 staff, took on three apprentices this year and hopes to take on three or four next year. An excellent presentation from a very talented young business woman that is doing great for our community.
