Cloud Seeding - Tracy Crowe

resentation by Tracy Crowe and Andrew Peace on the Snowy Hydro's cloud seeding. Andrew has a master's degree in Science, and explained that cloud seeing is the induction of minute particles into suitable clouds to encourage snow flake

growth. Some clouds are "efficient' and have enough ice crystals to convert this super cooled liquid into snow. Other clouds are 'naturally inefficient' ice crystals. Minute particles of silver oxide and indium (111) oxide can be released into the clouds to allow liquid water droplets to freeze into snow. Less than 24 grams of silver iodide and 17 grams of indium (111) oxide per square kilometre is used each year – that's about a tablespoon full - in the case of silver, this is less silver than you would find in a 1966 fifty cent piece. Andrew showed us the cloud seeding area they cover from Selwyn, Cabramurra Khancoban to Thredbo and then back to Selwyn. The control centre is at the Snowy Hydro centre with remote service facilities at Blue Calf, Cabramurra and weather balloons and measuring sites. Snow pack samples are collected following seeding operations. Hun-

dreds of soil, sediment, moss, water and aquatic ecology samples are collected each year as part of the environmental monitoring program. There is no evidence that cloud seeding operations had an adverse impact due to this trail and no evidence of impact on snow habitation or of difference in the concentrations of ammonia and nitrogen oxides in seeded and unIssue: 15 December

seeded snow. The Snowy Hydro cloud seeding trial started in 2005 and due to end in 2014. Snowy Hydro has written to the NSW Government negotiating an agreement to allow the ongoing program to continue, but the government has not responded as yet. There does not appear to be any reason to delay further future cloud seeding. An independent evaluation showed that cloud seeding increased snowfall by 14%. As the slide of the water cycle shows, the sun warms the water over the ocean, causes evaporation which rises to form moist air, water droplets form creating clouds, condensation then precipitation, and falls

as droplets. The water then hits the land, and flows back to the sea to start again.
