

ony Slater spoke to the club on his recent visit as a volunteer to remote parts of East Timor. Working as part of a dentists group that has been operating since 2003, Tony travelled with his friend and sometime locum, Andy Moran. They visited villages that have never had dental ser-

vices although there had been five other visits to other parts of East Timor in 2010. Tony spoke of the difficulties encountered – the language barrier, the lack of trafficable roads, and the variety of facilities from basic to reasonably up to date. Tony also mentioned the nature of the people: even though most facilities such as schools and hospitals had been destroyed in a 'scorched earth' policy during the Indonesian occupation, the

people were happy and were not harbouring grudges against the Indonesians. The East Timorese and the priests and nuns stationed there are welcoming and hospitable. Tony and Andy would see 58 patients in one day; during the visit no extractions went wrong. Both Rotary and Lions have dentist teams in PNG, the amount of work to be done being enormous, both in dental work and also in dental hygiene. The time taken to travel from one centre to another, e.g. 170km in 8 hours, impacts on the volume of treatment that can be done.
