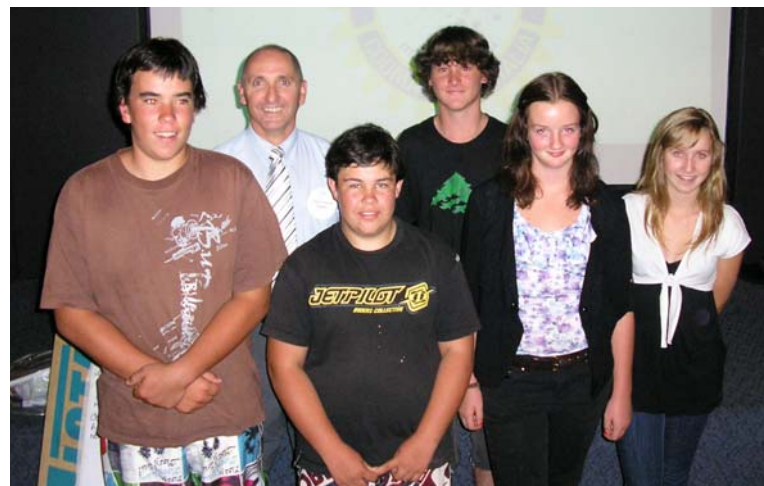

On Wednesday night the club hosted our Kemabolo adventurers and parents for dinner. President Chris, Steve S, and Treasurer Les gave a PowerPoint presentation covering the work and planning that had so far been completed for the project. The project includes well over 200 pushbikes with spares. Over 50 computers fully loaded with software including laptops to create a school computer network for the students. Books for the school library and text books appropriate for the current syllabus. Sporting equipment, musical instruments including 21 guitars, drums and a PA system. Denise Green, Deputy Nurse Manager of Cooma hospital will form an integral part of the team and will supervise the refurbishment of the village medical aid post and train selected villagers in first aid. Denise has been collecting supplies and equipment for many months to replenish the village aid post.
