eter Cochran went riding in the National Park in Queensland for a few days and was impressed with their management systems. He described it as a park with good landscapes, nice views, pretty waterfalls and a countryside untouched. KNP is the greatest national asset but he is critical of its management. How can the

park be managed better? It's managed by the wrong people because the personnel are science people who understand the ecology but not the tourism, heritage and economics as they are not qualified for that. Feral animals should be managed by the Agricultural Department because that's what they do; fire experts warned about the 2003 fires; TSM or a similar organisation should manage tourism. They don't employ enough specialist people. Cabramurra has great potential as a ski resort but is restricted by Snowy Hydro, National Parks, and political influences. His ideas are to make a better access to the park to

reinforce the tourism part of the park as it's not easy to access unless you walk in. They need to change the legislation. Happy Jack Road is good enough for bus/tourism transport and should be opened up for people who are less ablebodied. Better access for a greater variety of people.
