Numeralla Gold Fields - Ken Dane

uest speaker was Rotarian Ken Dane, who spoke on the Numeralla Gold Fields. Ken moved to Numeralla in 1984 and has been heavily involved in the community, particularly the Numeralla Landcare. Gold mining started in Kian-

dra in 1858 and finished in about 1870. Miners on their way to Kiandra often tried mining at Big Badga on Undo Creek and later shifted 5km south east of the existing Numeralla village. Chinese arrived in 1868 but left in 1871. They built various races on Undo Creek with rock, earth and stone. A dam was built on Undo Creek with funds raised at Wards Hotel (now Cooma Hotel) and a battery powered rock crushing water wheel was also used. In 1868 the Chinese tried to tunnel under the Numeralla River to the cemetery side but the tunnel collapsed. Two drowned and had to be buried outside the cemetery, because they were Chinese. Chinese markings can still be seen on the stones. At the Picnic Races in 1865 Mrs. Agnew's wedding ring and "a veil that was so fine it could be drawn through the ring" were stolen . Police caught the thieves at "Jinbum" Braidwood, and they were later hung. Also the Clarke Bushrangers lived on a mountain known as Clarke Mountain. While panning and sluicing for gold is still permitted, dredging is no longer permitted due to the erosion it causes. The first part time school opened in Numeralla in 1856 but there was diphtheria epidemic in 1870 that killed many of the school children.
