My Life - Jim Hatfield

uest speaker, Rotarian Jim Hatfield, was born in Bunyip in Victoria, where his family had a small dairy farm, milking 30-40 cows twice a day. Jim didn't like milking cows at all and did all he could to get out of it, especially when the engine that supplied power for the milking machines (they didn't have electricity) broke down and the cows had to be milked by hand. He had to ride a push bike three miles each way to primary school, and dink/double his sister on his bike.

When Jim was at high school he had to ride his bike three miles to the train station, the train for 20 miles, and then walk one and a half miles to the school. After year four at high school he joined the Air Force and trained at the Wagga Wagga

base, the training included shorthand and typing. During his 23 years in the RAAF, he was stationed at East Sale, Laverton, Townsville, Melbourne and Wagga Wagga, he also spent a bit of time in PNG. Also as a second job, which many RAAF personnel take on, assisted his boss to establish a resort at Radical Bay, Magnetic Island. Whilst at Townsville, Jim used his typing and shorthand skills as a court reporter. In 1975 was awarded the British Empire medal "for exceeding targets in all ar-



eas". Whilst on a careers advisory job in Batlow, he asked for an assistant WRAAF and Mary Zonder, now Mary Hatfield, was sent over from Wagga Wagga. He asked her "where have you been all my life" and her response was "I wasn't born for half of it". They were wed in 1974 and have four children. Interestingly his son, Andrew painted, "Will U Marry Me"(to his now wife) on the flank of a horse, but as he used oil based paint took a while to get it off the horse. The family have hosted exchange students and kept in touch with them over the years. Jim left the Air Force in 1978 and commenced a career in the finance industry, his last posting was in Cooma at Service One Members Banking. The Hatfields have just completed this years census collection and have decided not to volunteer to do it next time, but spend their time touring around with their caravan and push bikes.
