Three Minuter - Margaret Hassall

Margaret Hassall shared with us what she is learning while studying for a Masters Degree in Applied Linguistics at Monash. She has always been fascinated by words, their meanings and their origins, and found Australian colloquialisms fascinating. Australia is an interesting country in that there is not a huge variety of accents in speech as contrasted with Britain and the USA, although South Australians, such as Richard Lawson, may owe their accent to the fact there was no convict settlement in that state. There are some regional differences,



for example pronunciation of "castle or 'cahstle'. There are different words used in different areas for example 'port' for suitcase. It is fairly obvious the young people are using words far different from what we have known. There are many words we have never heard of before that are in constant use by teenagers. Margaret carried out a small survey to look at some colloquialisms used by people over 50 and under 30. All but one of the older respondents knew at least 12 out of 15 colloquialisms, where as some of the younger respondents knew as few as three.
