Vocational - Margaret Hassall

uest speaker was Rotarian Margaret Hassall, who was born in Nowra. When Margaret was eight the family moved to Queensland, she grew up on a dairy farm, and her first ambition was to get off the farm. Margaret did her teacher training at Kelvin Grove and at 18 was a fully qualified teacher. The love of her life is her vocation of teaching, but really the vocation of learning. She said there were the ups and downs, twists, turns, evolution and constant redefinition, but did not lose the original love of teaching. Margaret has always been energised by people as they learn, but more so as she knows she has made a positive contribution to their learning. Margaret taught in Queensland for four years, became engaged to Roger, a Cooma lad whom she met on holidays in Brisbane, moved to Cooma; taught at Cooma North, Cooma East, OLHC, Brigidine High and in 1970 teaching full time there. At first she was teaching History and French, then onto Geography, Music, Indonesian, Maths and religious education.

Obviously she had to undertake a lot of study to cover all these subjects. She said teaching has become much harder since the 60's with many more social and family problems impacting on the children. Margaret shared with us some unexpected funny moments, on one of her reports it read "Margaret is too smart for her own good" and at scripture class when the students learnt a song "Jesus wants me for a sunbeam" which the class changed to "Jesus wants me for a mix master". For the last 30 years she has been organising 10 and 20 year reunions, said it was re-



warding to find out what students have been up to and know you have been part of their journey. Margaret enjoyed the contact with the people of Cooma/Monaro, students, ex-students and colleagues, even Alyson and Kevin. Margaret officially retired in 2008, but is still a relief teacher at St Pats, and tutoring students. She was paid a compliment by Ronald McDonald House for assisting one of the students she tutors. She concluded by saying that kids today will possibly have three to four, even 5, different careers, while her career of 50 years in the same job, has been multi skilling, but feels fortunate to have been part of so many people's lives.
