Independence in 1917 from the Swedes and Russians. Finland is often called the land of thousands of lakes and islands; there are 190,000 lakes and 180,000 islands. starts at the age of 7 and is compulsory to 9th grade. All equipment and lunch is free. But in high school and university, books and equipment are charged. The most popular sports are ice hockey, ski jumping, skiing, F1 racing. Finland loves to beat Sweden and in 1995 won 4-1 and 2011 6-1 in ice hockey. Salmiakki which is a salty licorice is a famous Finnish food . Frazer is a popular chocolate, Mammi a traditional Easter dessert. Mustamakkara is a black sausage eaten in Tampre with lingonberry jam. Karelian pastry is a





traditional substitute for bread, Pilma is a Finish drink (sour milk). Also mentioned Christmas hams, rutabago casserole, ianttuloatikko, potato and carrot casserole. The Sauna is a famous Finnish invention and temperatures in the sauna range between 80°C and 100°C. Linda showed pictures of landscapes, famous buildings and people. The most important industries are wood, metal, technology and electronics, but Nokia is one of the biggest and most important companies in Finland. Linda's pictures of home included everywhere covered in snow, her pet dog and her horse which she has ridden since she was five. An excellent presentation Linda and as Mark said at his introduction, your visit here was not good for Finland but great for us.
