Three Minuter - Dugald Mitchell

Dugald told us of growing up at Alvaholme, Narromine when there were also a couple of stockmen fed in the kitchen with the family. A wood stove and kerosene fridge shared with an adjoining house. No kitchen sink, hot water was boiled on the stove. In 1938 a sixty foot tower for an electric wind mill was installed, which was heard day and night, it charged 16 x12 volt batteries. On wet days the kids all put bowls on the lawn to catch fresh water. The loo was about 80 yards from the house via a path through the vegie patch. Washing day was Monday



all clothes had to be boiled, scrubbed or both. The children's education was Blackfriars Correspondence School in Sydney, with Mum as supervisor. In 4th Class they rode ponies to Haberworth School. The first ute was a Chev, the two younger ones rode in the front with dad and mum, Dugald and his sister sat on a spring seat in the back. Travelling to Katoomba in 1944 he got very wind burnt. However, in 1947 the family got a very smart Rover sedan. I think this bought back many memories for a few of us.


