Tom Bellgard's insight into his early years - born In Calcutta, when his ancestors fled to escape the French revolution his earliest memories were of a small Welsh mining village called Llanhilleth. They didnt go hungry as his father was a doctor, but some did it hard but were proud people. His father treated a child and refused to accept a fee, so the father bought back a bag of spuds.

After a few years they moved to Cardiff the Welsh capital and had only been there a few years when they started to get bombed almost nightly. At every near miss his father added another layer of cement on the underground air raid shelter in the backyard. After a close miss Tom & his sister were sent to a boarding school. On leaving school with excellent results, he didnt go to uni, but enlisted in an 8 year aircrew engagement with the RAF with his first posting at Shackleton . Their long flights started on Friday night, they flew all day on Saturday and returned home on Sunday morning. The flight consumed 3,292 gallons of fuel.
