Peter Davis
Battle of Giarabub

Les Sutcliffe introduced Peter who spoke about his passion for military history, his current project and the differences between legends such as ANZAC and cowardly Italians, and the reality.

Peter described the evolution of the genres of Australian military histories starting with propaganda, official, popularist and now historiographical which critically examines all previous material to try to arrive at the truth.

Examples of historic perceptions such as the bronzed 6'4" Aussie, natural soldier, strong on mateship and sportsmanship or Italians soldiers carrying white flags and always surrendering were challenged by Peter.

Peter is currently working on a thesis at the Defence Force Academy in Canberra, on the Battle of Giarabub, an obscure incident in North Africa where 22 Australians and 250 Italians were killed following a 5 month siege.

It was the first battle and had the first casualty for the Australians in WW2, but was overshadowed by the much larger battles of Bardia, Tobruk and El Alamein.

The fact the Italians held out under siege on half rations for 5 months highlighted the reality of Italian military tenacity.

Slides showed maps, pictures of the desert fort then and now, the Italian's 300 km barbed wire fence and examples of materials used for research.



Peter finished by describing how, as in almost every Australian country town, every village or town in Italy has a memorial to their war dead.

Chris Adams – opening his talk with the playing of his bagpipes – his talk being about the history of the bagpipes. It is believed that the bagpipes originated in the Middle East and spread throughout Europe. (Perfected by the Scots of course!) Were used as an instrument of war and played during battles. Originally the bag was made from leather – whole sheep/lambs were used in the construction of the bagpipes.

After the Battle of Culladon, the bagpipes (and tartans) were outlawed by the British.

The modern bagpipe, although similar in construction – the materials are quite different. Synthetic materials are now used except for the reed in the chanter which is still natural – usually reed or bamboo.
