Guest Speaker: Adrian Bell, Principal Monaro High School Intro: Margaret H Thanks: Kevin D

This week our guest speaker was Adrian Bell, Principal of Monaro High School. He shared with us some of his experiences at previous schools that he has taught at across rural New South Wales.

After this he proceeded to ask "What is Gonski?". Gonski is the most comprehensive investigation of the way schools are funded in Australia. The final report was released in 2012 and found Australia is investing far too little in education, particularly in public schools. As a result of this lack of funding many students are missing out on the resources they need and this is resulting in growing gaps in achievements.

Gonski recommended a \$5 billion a year injection of funding into schools (750% to public schools) and an overhaul on distribution to ensure the

In NSW funding that goes directly to public schools need to be increased to 70% from the current 10%.

Some of the changes this would create which would benefit students would be:

- Smaller class sizes:
- Extra specialist teachers in literacy and numeracy;
- Greater support of students with high needs or disabilities;
- Additional training and classroom support for teachers.

Adrian said the report also found that:

- Around 12% of students have a disability
- A further 7.3 have additional needs relating to difficulties in learning behaviours including dyslexia, reading, communicating and ADHD.

He feels that decisions need to be made to build a better public school culture that promotes creativity and innovation and where teachers are encouraged and supported to try new things. Also that decisions should be made at the local level - it is a big change and a long overdue recognition of the capability and professional judgement of leaders in our schools. Local decision making will ensure that NSW continue to have a great public school system. Adrian told us that the framework for Monaro High students is quality leadership, quality instruction, quality learning relationships, improving outcomes and opportunities for all students. He also said that he enjoys communicating with other Principals in the area to
