The Community Chest which is currently being organised came about after Kay and Adrian Chapman from Cowra called into to her shop. They left a brochure with her outlining what they did in Cowra with their Community Chest. They asked if the Cooma community would be interested in starting their own Community Chest and the more that Marnie read the more she was convinced that Cooma would be interested. After the Dancing with the Cooma Stars fundraiser had been completed she contacted a number of community organisations including Rotary to gage interest and then invited all the contacted organisations to a meeting and subsequently a steering committee and board was created. The board consists of 11 people from various areas of experience and expertise within the Cooma community.

The first step was to become incorporated and the second step was to apply to the Tax Office to be able to issue receipts for donations. An initiative to have a constant source of monies coming in was to introduce memberships of \$10 per annum. Current patrons are John Cahill and Dean Lynch and there is support from all the smaller townships around the area. The commitment of the townships is to host one event a year to contribute money to the chest. It is hoped to have an official launch in about 3 months.

There is a single contact person with a large amount of experience, he is Bruce Bashford. His role will be to act as a single point of contact for enquires also he will allocate a request number so any request for financial assistance is confidential. The request is then assessed by a committee as to eligibility for assistance. There will be no cash payments made to the requestor but accounts would be paid or food or wood purchased on their behalf. Feedback from the community has been positive and many people have already volunteered their time or materials.

The team in Cowra have been in operation for 9 years and have learnt from experience the biggest hurdle is getting the people to believe in what the Community Chest is doing. That it is a genuine offer of assistance. To help the Cooma Community Chest get underway they have offered to be mentors so we can take advantage of their experience.

The main aim of the Community Chest is to offer assistance when all other possible avenues have been exhausted. It really is a port of last resort. For example if Government assistance is available then the requestor would be referred to seek assistance from the relevant department. Word of the resource would be spread through Church groups, health services and a variety of publicity.

Assistance requests can be small or large, examples from the Cowra experience include paying for a load of wood, meeting the gap for medical services and purchasing a vehicle with a lift mechanism. In the last example the vehicle remains the property of the Community Chest but the user pays for the rego and running costs for as long as they need the use of the vehicle.
