# Guest Speakers: Peter Hendy - Liberal Candidate Eden Monaro Intro: Kevin D Thanks: Tony S

Our guest speaker tonight was Peter Hendy, the Liberal Candidate for the Eden Monaro Shire. He understands that the position of Rotary is non-political so he has chosen to share with us some facets of his life.

He has lived in the region for about 30 years, he came down in the January of 1983 for work. he has been living happily with his wife Bronwyn and two children Caroline and Patrick in Queanbeyan for the past 12 years. Bronwyn is a music teacher and she teaches in Queanbeyan and is a former ABC TV journalist and executive producer for the 7.30 Report but decided that she didn't want to do that any more so she went to music teaching. His daughter Caroline is 16, beautiful, intelligent and a black belt in Karate, she is part of the national squad and will be going to the world championships this year. His son Patrick who is 15 and is into robotics participated with a mate in a schools robotic competition called "Dancing Robots" where you program robots to move to music. They were the ACT national champions and they came second overall in Australia. The boys were also invited to be representatives in the world championships this year.

As for himself, Peter grew up in a small business family, both his parents were Pharmacists. He found that growing up in a small business family instils certain values, such as perseverance, hard work and self reliance. He has based his life and his career on those values. He chose not to do pharmacy at university but studied economics instead. He got a first class honours degree and was picked-up as a cadet for the Federal Treasury in 1983. He not only worked for Treasury but also spent sometime in Sydney in the Cabinet office of the NSW government, also known as the Premiers Department. He has also done time in the private sector running his own business as an economic consultant and also been the CEO of the Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ACCI). As the CEO part of his role was to oversee the processes for the four main tasks of the ACCI which are education and training, taxation, international trade and industrial relations. The other thing he has done in his career is that he has held various positions in politics as a Chief of Staff for various Cabinet Ministers. He realised the responsibility of this position when working for the Minister for Defence on the day it was decided to send Australian troops to Afghanistan following the 9/11 attack. As an economist and expert on taxation issues he was quite outspoken regarding the Howard governments ideas on taxation and to try to get him to "see the light", Peter Costello appointed him and Dick Warburton to undertake a review of taxation and hopefully come to the conclusion, with the assistance of Treasury, that Australia did not need tax reform. Peter and Dick produced a review on "International Comparison of Australian Taxation System." Overall we have a pretty good system compared to some others but there a still a number of things to do to make it better. He has also spent time working overseas in Bahrain. He was headhunted to go and work over there for the Crown Prince who ran the Economic Development Board. He was made Executive Director of Public Sector reform - or so he thought but once he came to understand how things worked he decided to keep his integrity intact, resigned and returned to Australia.

The final thing he shared with us of which he is quite proud is that he was Director of the Australian Made Australian Grown campaign, the kangaroo in the triangle label, which has been very successful in promoting Australian goods both here and overseas.

## Three Minuter

The three minuter this week was presented by Patrick K and he shared with us a little about Chinese New Year. This year the Chinese New Year started on 10 February and is the Year of the Snake. As the Chinese use the Lunar calendar for their festivals the date of the New Year changes. The date corresponds to the new or black moon in either late January or early February. In 1914 China took on the western calendar (the new calendar) but still make reference to the Chinese calendar (the old calendar) Chinese New Year is the main festival and biggest celebration of the year but it is not a religious festival.

Chinese New Year is also known as the Spring Festival and the celebrations usually last for 15 days. One tradition is the giving of lucky money in red envelopes. Children get lucky money from their parents and from their elders and married adults. Single people do not give red envelops. Employers also give red packets to their staff at the first day of work commencing in the New Year.

According to legends, the beginning of Chinese New Year started with a fight against a mythical beast called the Nian. The Nian would come on the first day of the new year and eat livestock, crops and even people. The villagers would put out food for the Nian in the hope that after eating the food it wouldn't eat the livestock, crops or people. One time it was observed that Nian was frightened away by a child wearing red and the people understood that Nian was afraid of the colour red. This is why red lanterns and red scrolls are hung from windows and doors. Fire crackers are also used to scare the Nian away There is a New Year Eve celebration. This is the time to have family reunions and enjoy a good night. People will not go to sleep until after the beginning of the year and say that by staying awake means they will treasure every minute of the year. It also expresses a wish for a long life for their parents.
