

# Guest Speaker - John Gill - Cooma Community Radio Intro: Mark J-N Thanks: Brian J

Our guest speaker with week was John Gill from 2MNO, Monaro Community FM radio. Monaro Community Radio (MCR) was formed through a perceived need by a group of residents who wished for alternative radio entertainment compared to that presented by the mainstream. The purpose of the station is to have MCR recognised as a premier Community Radio Station in country NSW which is seen as assisting in the cultural, economic and social developments of the Monaro and Snowy Mountains region. The airmis the operation of a sustainable broadcasting service that provides the local community and visitors with entertainment and information, our members with recreational and learning opportunities and our sponsors with value for money. Their business structure is similar to many other associations in that they have a corporate structure with a full executive who are elected from membership at the AGM. The main subcommittees are production, programming, fundraising and sponsorship.

In 1996 the station was located in a ex-chook shed in the backyard of a home in Nimmitabel and 10 years later moved to Cooma to the old Express Building in Bombala St and they are now located in Commissioner St. There have 4 transmitters which are located at Bombala, Nimmitabel, Cooma and Jindabyne and the broadcast area extends to some areas of the coast and parts of Bega but the main coverage areas are Bombala, Delegate, Nimmitabel, Cooma, Jindabyne and Adaminaby.

They are a not for profit organisation and survive by virtue of a very small but strong group of volunteers who work tirelessly to raise funds. Their fundraising methods are raffles, fairy floss, pop corn and iced slushie drinks at markets, fairs and shows around the region. There are 23 volunteer presenters, who have been taught and trained in broadcasting this includes 5 people from Workability and Challenge. There are always opportunities for new presenters to be welcomed and trained. Volunteers present their programs at various times throughout the week using their own music and creating their own programs. There is also an extensive library of CD's available for use also.

MCR currently has over 50 members, there are regular monthly meetings to discuss the business plan and current events that may need attention, these meetings are always followed by a cuppa and a chat.

John invited everyone to tune in to listen to the programs as there is something for everyone ranging from Jazz to Country, Popular to Classical and also local news.

#### 3 Minuter

The 3 Minuter this week was presented by Claire N and reflected on obtaining work.

In 1954 she got her first job through the Nun's at her school in Brisbane. She had an interview, got the job and started the following week. They were a Catholic firm and sent her to church at the cathedral behind the office every Friday. At the time she thought there must be more to life than working as a shorthand typist in a Queen St legal office. Her mother said to her 'a rolling stone gathers no moss' and to this day she disagrees. Claire left the law firm and went on to work in Darwin, Alice Springs, Mt Isa, Pt Moresby, Cairns, Sydney and after hitching a ride in a VW across the Nullarbor, Perth. All these jobs were obtained by a phone call followed by an interview, back in the day before resume's and applications in which you had to address selection criteria.

1985 saw her arrive in Cooma to a newly built house. She was devastated when she could not find any employment here so she had to look further afield to Canberra. She gained work in the typing pool at Defence, where she was adopted as "Mother Hen" by all the much younger female staff.

Commuting proved too much so she rented a caravan in a backyard during the week, returning to Cooma for the weekends. Eventually she gained a position at the Commonwealth Employment Agency as an employment officer and was later promoted to manager, where she enjoyed the last 10 years of her working life. This was the start of the era of submitting written applications and addressing selection criteria. She remembers how disappointed the job seekers were when they did not get an interview or at times even an acknowledgement of their application. She recalls offering comfort to many of them.

These varied places of employment bought some amazing adventures like swimming in the Daly River, finding out later crocodiles had been sighted there, shooting buffalo in Humpty Doo Park, visiting an Aboriginal mission island, assisting the Red Cross in PNG packing goods after a disaster, booking in fatigued American soldiers for their R & R and working underground in Mt Isa for a mine superintendant. The work in the hotel/motel industry allowed her encounters with the likes of Liberace, Johnny Farnham, The Ink Spots and the now ill famed Rolf Harris.
