



Guest Speaker - Allan Spencer - National Busking Competition Intro: Wolfgang Thanks: Mark J-N

Allan and Leslie Spencer have lived in Cooma for the last 30 years, come next year. They have taught music as full time careers, opened a music shop and raised a family here. A goodly number of children they have taught have gone on to a variety of music careers. They also teach music to adults too.

Many people in Cooma have heard about the Australian National Busking Festival now but it started as quite a few years ago as an idea. Allan noticed many country towns had music festivals of varies types and the impact on the towns involved is quite phenomenal. He thought Cooma was missing out in so many ways by not having something like this.

Music festivals have a number of interesting facts and figures for example:

The Woodford Folk Festival is held in the hinterlands north of Brisbane, which has a very small permanent population which increases to 130,000 people over the 6 days of the event in January. It is estimated this festival raised \$21,000,000 for the economy of Queensland.

The Tamworth Country Music Festival is now considered to be the biggest country music festival in the world.

Other festivals include the Numeralla Folk Festivals, the Jindabyne Irish Festival, the Goulburn Blues Festival, the Cobargo Folk Festival along with many other all across the country.

When he first had the idea he realised he couldn't do it by himself. He thought he could get the ball rolling and engage or encourage others to provide experienced assistance, as he didn't feel qualified, but as it turns out he with others are learning as they go.

He looked at doing a festival which was different to all the others on offer out there. He wondered what could be done in Cooma that we as a town could afford, but would be significantly different which was when he came up with the idea of the Busking Festival.

The good thing about the Busking Festival is that you are not having to pay for "Star performers" and everything can be done on a shoestring budget. Also, it involves all types of music genres from classical to pop and everything in between. Looking at last year's festival approximately \$35,000 was generated for businesses in town in one day. They are hoping to at least double the impact this year by holing the event over 2 days and having the support from the attendees at the Feast of Festival weekend. With this they hope to have some 200 buskers performing, there are a larger number of performance categories and there is \$5,000 in prize money to be awarded which has been provided by sponsorship from local businesses. The future directions for the Festival is to trade mark the name to protect the association with Cooma, encourage trade back into town by exposure and to apply for grants which can make the event even bigger and better.

This is an opportunity to show Australia and maybe even the world what a wonderful place Cooma is.
