Literacy

Meeting - 9 July 2014



Rebecca's last meeting with us before she returned to Switzerland, flying out on Friday. President Peter gave Rebecca a souvenir of her stay in Cooma.



Guest speaker, Rose Ricketson, spoke about the Big hART project in developing a stage show that tells the story of this local area. Exploring its multicultural past, cosmopolitan future and all in between, the investigation taps into different elements of the varied Cooma community: the rich history of the Snowy Hydro-Electric Scheme and more recent migration; old farming families; ski enthusiasts; the broad arts community and the tourism industry.

The project explores Cooma's multicultural legacy, the unique stories of the area and engages different groups through workshops held over the next 15 months, including music and song, movement and dance, poetry, photo and story collection and recipe sharing.

When the project comes to fruition, there will be live musical performances with professional actors such as Lex Marinos as well as amateur actors. Coma is the only town in Australia where such a project is being conducted to inquire into the makeup of the community.

In her talk, Elaine Mooney gave a potted history of the law firms in Cooma. The first Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages, Robert Dawson was also the Police Magistrate. The first solicitors arrived in the town around 1870 and others followed. The two firms, Walker Gibbs & King and Blaxland, Mawson & Rose, have been in existence for over 100 years, although the name of each firm has varied over the years. Rotarians Elaine Mooney and John Clarke have worked here as solicitors for many years. There are now three firms in the town.


