#### **RON STAPLETON**

A member of a family that has connections to the meat industry since 1869, Ron has been involved in setting standards of meat grading through his membership of the Meat Standards Advisor Council (MSA). Australia has an excellent system, second only to USA.

There are several factors taken into consideration when grading meat including weight for age, toughness and marbling. It has been found that toughness is caused by stress and this can occur when individual animals are separated from their original group, or are handled roughly especially when en route to the abattoir. Varying seasons do not help cattle as they grow gristle instead of muscle to cope with the cold. Toughness is measured in the ph level, which should be no more than 5.8. Another cause of toughness is the use of hormone growth promotants, HGP: at least one of the supermarket chains now will not sell meat that contains HGP. Marbling does not increase tenderness but leads to more flavour. When conducting experiments on taste, 30,000 taste tests were used.

Cattle yards must comply with standards set by the MSA: concreted, well drained, with water and feed available. Animals should be slaughtered within 24 hours of being delivered to yards.

Consumer preferences have changed over the years with some of the success of fast food outlets occurring because of the



reluctance of people to chew their meat.

Most of the early work on meat standards has been conducted on beef, but lamb is now the focus of taste tests and the determining of standards.
