

Katrin: AGM on 3 December.


Darrell: Thank you to all who helped with the duties at the Combined Service Clubs Dinner as well as those who played the role of host superbly.

Kaye and Colin Stopp took part in a bike ride to Uluru to raise funds for and awareness of prostate cancer. The venture, known as The Long Ride, involved 70 bikes and their riders ranging in age from 81 to 8, many of the riders having a defence background. They were able to stay at defence bases such as Sale and Watsonia. Most days the bikers travelled about 600km and were struck by the generosity of ordinary people. At Woomera they were given a Welcome to Country as well the proceeds of a collection -\$600. The total collected was over \$320,000. Kaye and Colin covered over 6000km. The Long Ride takes place every 18 months and next time will go to Darwin.


