

GUEST SPEAKER

Tony Nassar spoke about his Amphicar and his attendance at a special event to honour Ron Radford who brought the first Amphicar into Australia. Ron, at the age of 94, is a member of the Umina Rotary Club and has been a Rotarian for 64 years. He was a pharmacist at Woy Woy and used his Amphicar to travel to work through the water rather than going by road, a much longer trip. The event was so well patronised that many members of the crowd had to remain outside the venue, 160 inside and up to 400 outside.

Tony's car is a 1964 model, taken delivery by Ron Radford in 1965. It has doors which are not found in other examples of amphibious vehicles. Tony showed footage of the car in Sydney Harbour with the Opera House under construction in the background.

The great enemy of these cars that were built of mild steel is salt water. The use of plastics and aluminium was just not feasible at the time. 3,800 cars were made, 3,000 going to USA. There are about 600 left in existence at present, those lost succumbing to the damage of salt water.

The Amphicar is the only amphibious vehicle to have reverse gear.
