Our guest speaker this week was Ivy Henderson – Multicultural Project officer for MAGIC.

The Multicultural Activity Group in Cooma has recently had a name change to the Multicultural Activity Group in our Communities as the project has now been extended to include Jindabyne but they are still knowns as MAGIC.

What is MAGIC – they are a group who consist of young and old people from more than 50 different ethnic backgrounds. They are a variety of shades of black, white and brown. Some are new to the Monaro and others have been here since the time of the Snowy Scheme.

The Group supports a number of projects including the Monaro Refugee Support Group,

the Brown Box which is a small business that is a part of the Renew Cooma initiative. The name came about as anything can be put into a box. They also hold a variety of workshops which may look like people having a good time but provide a forum for serious discussions on topics such as healthy relationships or domestic violence.

They have gardening projects held at the Cooma Community gardens at which people new to Cooma can learn about what grows in such a cold climate. Along with playgroup project where older members of the community interact with young children. They have a grandpa from India teaching young children how to plant and tend to plants.

A recent fun project was with Italian ladies teaching Chinese ladies how to make pizza.



There are 2 major cultural festivals celebrated in Cooma. These are Diwali/Divali - the Indian Festival of Light at which dressing up in a sari is acceptable for everyone (women and men). And Koh Phangan – the Full Moon Festival.



A recent TAFE workshop saw 15 volunteers attend to learn how to teach English to people who do not speak English well.

The dance groups are working hard for their presentations at the upcoming Multicultural Festival which is supported strongly by the Cooma Rotary Club. This festival introduces people to people providing a forum for developing new friendships.

The main point of MAGIC is to enable people to learn from each other and celebrate different cultures.


