




GUEST SPEAKER – Kevin Dunne – Issues in Dementia

- the different types (over 100) of dementia, 55% being caused by Alzheimer's Disease
- early symptoms: progressive and frequent memory loss, confusion, personality change, apathy and withdrawal and loss of ability to do everyday tasks
- 3 out of 10 people over the age of 85 and almost 1 in 10 over the age of 65 have dementia

Your Brain Matters, a new brain health program conducted by Alzheimer's Australia, stresses keeping our brain challenged, being socially active, healthy eating, regular physical activity and good heart health – avoiding smoking, excessive drinking, managing blood pressure, cholesterol, blood sugar and body weight. Kevin went on to speak about his journey with Maree and her Alzheimer's Disease from the early symptoms, first noticed in 2002, to the present stage where Maree is high care. Maree is living at home, but Kevin is grateful for the help that is available in Cooma: the Home Care package, level 4, provided by Cooma Monaro Home Nursing Service, and the Cooma Challenge Day Care Centre.

Recently Kevin was chosen to attend the international conference on dementia in Perth. Here he was able to share his experiences and learn from the other attendees. A cartoon program is being developed to help all those involved in Alzheimer's.

Of special help to Kevin are Verity Jackson, the Dementia Advisory Person for the Monaro, Ann Douglas who heads Monaro Home Nursing Service and Ruth Dakin who is coordinator of the Cooma Challenge Day Care Centre in Walgarra St. In addition, the support of family and friends and his faith are important factors in living in this challenging time.

At the end of his talk, Kevin received a standing ovation.
