Chris Adams -



Monaro Community Radio
John gave us an update of activities at Monaro
MNO Community Radio. Community Radio
began in 1972and supports the social and
cultural life of its community. Programs are
varied with styles from easy listening to country.
It provides important information for print
handicapped listeners. Local artists are named
and promoted whenever possible.

Monaro MNO now has four transmitters and two studios, one in Cooma and one in Nimmitabel. All the 32 presenters are members of the community and volunteer their time. There is always room for more people to become involved. It is possible to streamline Radio MNO so that it can be listened to via your computer.

Every day from 9 to 10 am there is a not for profit segment that promotes local events and activities with local news and items of interest. Although the emphasis is on serving the local community, the audience of MNO is Australia wide. The 'Good Morning' presenters are interested in networking with this local radio station because of its broad network.

The station is sponsored by many local businesses but funding is always an issue. The main income comes from local business sponsors and funds are raised by involvement in market selling fairy floss, slushies and popcorn. Some time ago, Rotary was a sponsor thanks to John Mercer's influence.
